The Conference papers will be published online on the Vilnius University Faculty of Law website and/ or at least in one open access database. Therefore, we kindly ask you to comply with the topic of the Conference, i.e. Digitalization in Law.

The submitted papers should be written in a clear, easy to understand manner, with correct grammar and be readable for a wide audience. **The Scientific Committee of the Conference will consider papers and will not publish incomplete or irrelevant papers.**

Requirements for papers

A paper should include the following parts:

1. Title
2. Information about the author (concise) in the 1st footnote.
3. Abstract (up to 300 words)
4. Keywords (4-5)
5. Introduction
6. Main body
7. Conclusions
8. Bibliography

Please make sure that you use British English. Papers should be 20 000 to 40 000 characters/ numbers (including footnotes and spaces) long. Font: Arial Narrow. Line spacing: single. Concerning the length and other details please follow the **Visual Requirements for Papers**.

Special attention should be paid to quotations, footnotes, and references. All citations and quotations must be verified before submission of the paper. The accuracy of the contribution is the responsibility of the author. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively, using the footnote function in Word so that if any footnotes are added or deleted the others are automatically renumbered.

A bibliography should be included in the end of the paper.

Books (author, 'title' (place of publication: publisher year) pages)

Example: F. Knight, 'Risk, Uncertainty and Profit' (Boston: Houghton Mifflin 1921) 19-20

Articles (author, 'title' [year] journal number pages)

Example: L. Kaplow, 'An Economic Analysis of Legal Transitions' [1986] 99 HLR 519

Legislations (authority title number year source)

Example: Council Directive (EC) 93/104 concerning certain aspects of the organisation of working time [1993] OJ L307/18 (Working Time Directive)

Cases

Examples: *Bressol and Others*, Case C-73/08 [2010] ECR I-02735; *Campbell and Fell v UK*, application no. 7819/77 [1984] 7 EHRR 165

Final remarks

The Deadline to submit final paper is **23rd of April, 2018**. All papers must be submitted via e-mail: phdconference@tf.vu.lt

Submitted papers are understood to final and could be only slightly amended after the conference. They must not have been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. Papers should be submitted in ".doc / .docx" format.

By submitting, author of a paper, agrees that the paper will be published by the Organisers of the Conference in the official website of the Faculty of Law of Vilnius University, other open access databases.
