The conference papers will be published online on the website of the Faculty of Law of Vilnius University and/or at least one open access database as special edition. Therefore, we ask you to observe the topic of the Conference. The papers should be written in a clear, easy to understand manner, grammatically edited and be readable for a wide audience. **The Scientific Committee of the Conference will consider papers and will not publish incomplete or irrelevant papers.**

Requirements for papers

A paper should include the following parts:

1. Title
2. Information about the author (concise) in the 1st footnote.
3. Abstract (up to 300 words)
4. Keywords (4-5)
5. Introduction
6. Main body
7. Conclusions
8. Bibliography

Please make sure that you use British English. Papers should be 20 000 to 40 000 characters / numbers (including footnotes and spaces). Font: Arial Narrow. Line spacing: single. Concerning size and other details please follow the **Visual Requirements for Papers**.

Special attention should be paid to quotations, footnotes, and references. All citations and quotations must be verified before submission of the paper. The accuracy of the contribution is the responsibility of the author. Footnotes should be numbered consecutively, using the footnote function in Word so that if any footnotes are added or deleted the others are automatically renumbered. A bibliography should be included in the end of the paper.

Books (author, 'title' (place of publication: publisher year) pages)

Example: F. Knight, 'Risk, Uncertainty and Profit' (Boston: Houghton Mifflin 1921) 19-20

Articles (author, 'title' [year] journal number pages)

Example: L. Kaplow, 'An Economic Analysis of Legal Transitions' [1986] 99 HLR 519

Legislations (authority title number year source)

Example: Council Directive (EC) 93/104 concerning certain aspects of the organisation of working time [1993] OJ L307/18 (Working Time Directive)

Cases

Examples: *Bressol and Others*, Case C-73/08 [2010] ECR I-02735; *Campbell and Fell v UK*, application no. 7819/77 [1984] 7 EHRR 165

Deadline to submit paper is **15th April 2019**. All papers must be submitted via e-mail:

Submitted papers are understood to be in principal final versions which can be only slightly amended after the conference. They must not have been published or submitted for publication elsewhere. Papers should be submitted in .doc /.docx format.
